



ARTICLE SUBMISSION GUIDELINE

Legal practitioners, judges, law lecturers, and law students are invited to submit articles, reviews of local court cases, bills and statutes to the MLR.

The contributions may be either in Dhivehi or English language or script.

Articles, case reviews, case notes, and law reviews submitted for publication will go through a review process. They must demonstrate a high quality of research and writing and must contribute significantly to existing legal scholarship by shedding new light on their chosen topic.

MANUSCRIPT SUBMISSION

Authors may submit an article by following these specific submission guidelines for the Maldives Law Review. The Maldives Law Review (MLR) requires only online submission without any submission of hard copies through the mail or as an e-mail attachment. For purposes of these Guidelines, the Maldives Law Review may be referred to as 'MLR' or the 'Journal', and authors who wish to submit Manuscripts as 'author(s)' and 'corresponding author(s)'.

PERMISSION & COPYRIGHT ASSIGNMENT

The corresponding author is responsible for obtaining written permission to republish or reproduce all previously published and copyrighted material "in print and other media" from the publisher of the original source. The corresponding author is also responsible for completing and returning to the editorial office or the publisher the journal-specific copyright transfer form, and any financial disclosure forms that might be required for a particular previous publisher or journal.

PREPARING MANUSCRIPT FILES

All manuscripts should adhere to the following minimum requirements. Failure to comply with these submission requirements might result in refusal on part of the Journal for publication.

WORD LIMIT

- **Case Review or Comment:** no longer than 2,000 words summarizing a recent case and critically analyzing its potential significance or importance in the further development of a particular area of the law. Most case comments should also provide an adequate summary of prior relevant jurisprudence.
- **Bill or Statute Review:** a piece no longer than 3,000 words that provides a critical appraisal of a recent bill or law.
- **Articles:** a piece no longer than 5,000 words on any legal topic that is useful to the development of Maldivian law.

TEXT

- Title Page (including acknowledgments for support),
- Abstract, (not more than 300 words)
- Introduction (if applicable)
- Materials and Methods, Results, and Discussion,
- References (following Chicago referencing or the Chicago Manual of Style, (15 Edition, 2003)
- Standard document format accepted is MSWord. PDF formats will NOT be accepted. Please email to lawreview@suoodanwar.com

BLACK & WHITE/GRAYSCALE FIGURES

To ensure the highest quality print production, figures must be submitted according to the following minimum resolutions in grayscale or black and white:

1200 dpi (dots per inch) for black and white line art (simple bar graphs, charts, or non-photographic artwork)

600 dpi for combination halftones (photographs that also contain line art such as labeling or thin lines)

300 dpi for halftones (black and white photographs)

Vector-based figures (usually created in Adobe Illustrator) should be submitted as JPEG.

MANUSCRIPT SUBMISSION CHECKLIST

Before manuscript submission, all of the following information must be included either in a cover email/letter:

- Names of the authors, in order as it is to be published.
- Name of the author designated as the corresponding author
- E-mail address
- Full postal address
- Telephone and fax number

IMPORTANT NOTICE

After acceptance, the editorial office forwards materials to the publisher, where the production department transforms the manuscript files into an article. Proofs may be made available for the author's review prior to online and/or print publication, depending on the journal's publishing policy. Following the copyediting of the article for style, grammar, nomenclature, and proper type-marking codes, the typesetter outputs page proofs and may notify the author via an e-mail alert that the proofs are available for viewing.

It is the author's responsibility to review the proofs and to mark all necessary corrections. Except under special circumstances, no further changes may be made once the marked proofs have been returned for processing.

While your corrections are important to us, we do reserve the right to publish your article as typeset with no further corrections. We emphasize that corrections must be received in a timely manner.

MLR shall be published quarterly. In general, once a paper is accepted and sent to the publisher, we aim to publish the article online as early view within 4-6 weeks. Please note that online publication constitutes official publication although the print citation may be issued subsequently.

Papers should be well-written. It is important that papers be copy-edited carefully before submission. Drafts are not acceptable. In order to ensure diversity of subject matter, approaches, and voices, papers by authors who have not published in MLR for at least a year prior to submission are normally given precedence. In submitting work to MLR, authors agree to the policies of this journal, including free access and use of the material published in it with, of course, proper acknowledgment of authorship and source.

All articles will be blind-refereed except when invited. The decision of the editorial board is final. Articles accepted for publication will be copyrighted by Maldives Law Review.

It is the responsibility of the author to obtain permission for the use of any copyrighted material, including images, sound, and video files. It is preferable to place images directly in the text but, when permission is unobtainable, it is acceptable to include a link to the image directly in the text.

Authors also agree that the statements of fact and opinion in the articles in the Maldives Law Review are those of the respective authors and contributors and not of the editors or sponsor of the Journal. No representation, express or implied, is made of the accuracy of the material in this journal and MLR cannot accept any legal responsibility or liability for any errors or omissions that may be made.
